Year 4 Summer Term 2 2025-6



English

In English we will be reading 'Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx' by Joe Todd Stanton and will look closely at how to make our writing more exciting, using a range of literary devices. We will use this knowledge to write a setting description, dialogue between characters and instructions.

The children will continue to learn and have opportunities to practise their spellings. In reading, the children will have the chance to talk to their peers about what they are currently reading and will have the opportunity to visit the school library weekly.

Science

To become scientists, we will continue to learn about sound. During this topic, we will be learning about what sound is, how it travels and about the pitch and loudness of sounds.

Maths

In Mathematics pupils will continue to work on arithmetic skills and applying them in various contexts.

This half term, our learning will focus on place value, statistics, solving 2- step addition and subtraction problems, decimals, and angles in geometry.

We also continue to have a big push on practicing our multiplication tables rapidly read

PE:

This term, Year Four will be enjoying cricket and rounders to develop their batting and fielding skills.



RSA4

This term the children will be completing their social action project. A group of children will be visiting Newman University to share their project with other schools within our trust.

Computing

In computing, we will be exploring data and how to gather and log data for a variety of purposes.

History

This half term, we will learn all about the achievements of the earliest civilizations – with an overview of where and when the first civilizations appeared and a depth study of The Romans.



DI

This half term, children will be making fresh versions of common shop-bought foods including pizza and soup.

Religion and World Views:
