

English:

In English, we will be exploring the text Jim and the Beanstalk. Children will be retelling the story in their own words and using adjectives to describe nouns. We will continue to use our phonics skills to build new words.

Children will have lots of opportunities to re-read their own writing to make sure it makes sense and edit punctuation if needed.

We will also explore the text 'What the Ladybird heard' which is set on a farm, and we will be using this story, written by Julia Donaldson, to create story maps of how the two thieves stole the fine prize cow!

We will continue with daily Read Write Inc sessions to consolidate our knowledge of sounds.

PSHE:

- Changing me

Children will be looking at body parts and learning the scientific names for them.

DT:

- In D&T, we will be understanding materials. We will be looking at the question 'Can you build with bread?'

Maths:

- We will continue to develop our addition and subtraction skills using one- and two-digit numbers.
- Children will learn the start of multiplication and division, looking at equal groups.
- We will continue to build on number facts through repetition, singing and chanting.
- Children will learn about money and look at different coins and notes.

PE:

- Athletics
- Striking and Fielding

Religion and World Views:

- In RE children will be looking at the main question – 'How should we care for the world and for others and why does it matter?'

Computing:

- Internet safety: pausing for people and balancing media.
- How to log on efficiently.
- Creative media and how to write on a computer.

Science:

- In science we will be revisiting plants and how they grow. We will identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.

History:

In history, we will be exploring more significant lives including Neil Armstrong, Mae Jemison, Bernard Harris Jr and Tim Peake.

Geography:

Study imaginary and real maps. Take part in simple fieldwork. Use inspiring books, such as We're Going on a Bear Hunt and The Storm Whale, to define the purpose of maps and then apply those skills to real situations in familiar settings.

Music

- In music, children will listen to different songs and explain how the different types of music make them feel.
