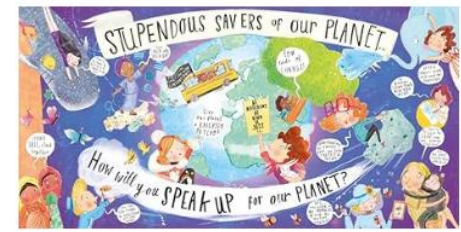
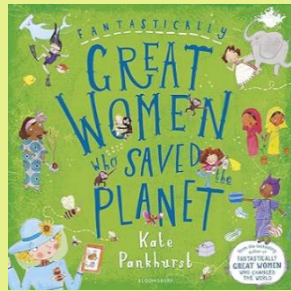


Curriculum Map

English

In English, Year Four will be exploring the non-fiction book 'Fantastically great Women who Saved our Planet' by Kate Pankhurst. We will be using this book as inspiration to help with excellent extended writing opportunities. This high-quality text has been chosen because it links to our learning about map skills and our planet.



Reading

To develop as readers, we will be continuing to work on comprehension skills. We will base some of this work around our key text but will enhance with other texts to develop our skills and understanding.

PE

This term Year Four will practise and refine their striking and fielding skills through athletics and football.

Design Technology

As design technologists, we will investigate how a switch is an interruption in a circuit and we will explore switches, being a widely used in a range of products. We will incorporate different types of switches into circuits to make a buzz wire game.

Art

During Art, we will be using some printing techniques including using some textiles and taking the Ghanaian artist Gilbert Ahiagble as our inspiration.



Science

In science, our new topic will be electricity. We will identify common appliances that run using electricity. We will also look at circuit symbols and we will construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers.

Thrive

During our Thrive sessions, we will be focusing on our RSA project. We will be working collaboratively on a social action project that we have planned and decided on as a class. We will then share their project with other schools within our Trust.

History

During this topic, we will be finding out about the achievements of this early civilisation: their buildings, their pharaohs, how they communicated and some of their key inventions.

Computing

In Computing, the children will learn how to edit media, using photo editing software. This will include skills such as cropping, changing size, adding images within the photo and considering the effect of these changes on the composition.

PSHE

During these sessions, we will be focusing on 'Identity, society and equality' with a focus around the topic of democracy. We will be learning about Britain as a democratic society, about how laws are decided upon and we will also learn about the local council.

Religion and World Views

In RWV this half term the children will build upon the work from last half term, exploring the big question 'How do people from religious and non-religious communities celebrate key festivals?'

Music

During our Music lessons, we will continue our Ukelele lessons.

Maths

This half term, we continue to have a big push on knowing our multiplication tables rapidly.

We will also be covering:

- Converting units of measure
- Perimeter and area
- Decimal addition and subtraction
- Reviewing the other topics we have learnt so far.

Our KIRF for this half term:

- recognise decimal equivalents of the fractions $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, tenths and hundredths.
